The safety training is vital along with the communications training which helps the group on the ground be able to communicate with the operator all the time.

Heavy equipment machines often work in extreme surroundings and are put under great strain on a regular basis. Thus, there are many heavy equipment jobs available in maintenance and repair. Operators of heavy machinery are really skilled workers who could troubleshoot, repair and diagnose heavy equipment on site or in a workshop. Mechanics need to be available to transport their tools to a job site and perform maintenance and repair in various surroundings.

It might be possible for delivery drivers to get work with simply a CDL, although for some jobs, certain endorsements may be required. For example, delivering huge pieces of equipment or components that are very large for construction projects will require the driver to complete further training to haul and handle oversize loads. Normally, the drivers operate together with chaperone vehicles that are driven by drivers who are trained. These chaperone vehicles usually escort the delivery truck to its destination.
