Penticton Forklift License - Within North America, obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can get a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machinery which is designed with various alternatives, like for instance sit-down and stand-up models, propane and electric versions, and different sizes and types to meet the industrial requirements of employees. Operator training courses are often individualized to be able address the certain kinds and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck inside a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift in a shipyard. The various forklifts and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, thus, tend not to concentrate on detailed course requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common method of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who offers this method of certification is required to provide classroom sessions and practical training on equipment at their place of work. Employers may opt to train employees on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The curriculum incorporates forklift operation methods, safety procedures, company rules and forklift maintenance. Subject matters specific to the worksite, like hazardous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize each and every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

When utilizing a third party trainer, the certification process would usually consist of an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It should be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a lift truck license through employer-provided training allows the operator to operate a forklift for that specific employer only.

The most significant factor of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one kind of equipment to another. Safety issues vary from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for example in offshore and marine uses.
