Penticton Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make sure that their employees are trained to work competently utilizing telehandler machines. The workers need to be assessed for their skill to utilize the equipment. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that staff attain the needed level of skill. The responsibility level of the person has to be taken into account when training is provided. Effective training would remedy whatever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training may be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment at the completion of the training period will determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not address such subject matters as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the use of other attachments, or the use of rotating machinery. Further training will have to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

Similar to any equipment, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear sooner or later. Proper maintenance is essential to ensuring safe operation of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems connected with damage, wear and deterioration. Workers require experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be seriously viewed and complied with, taking into account such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the owner and the user of the machine. General maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner while pre-use inspections are normally done by the user.
